



ARRIVAL AT SHOW GROUNDS

Horses stabling at Wyn for the weekend may arrive on site after 1PM on Friday.

If you are hauling-in, please check-in with the show office if you are going to be on the grounds any day you are not showing. There is a \$35 schooling fee that can be paid via Paypal, Venmo, or cash in person.

Water is available at the wash rack area. There are hoses in the wash racks, and a water container for filling buckets more quickly. You must provide your own buckets. Show stabling barns do not have water hydrants or electrical outlets.

Trailer and camper parking is located along the east side of the property, beyond the barns and across from the dressage arenas. If you follow the driveway (staying to the left), it will take you directly to the parking area. If you are stabling with us, please continue past the first section which is reserved for haul-in trailers. Smaller bumper pulled trailers can be backed into the tree line, longer rigs can be parked angled in the middle aisle facing southwest. Please allow enough room between vehicles and trailers for horse safety.



STABLING

Stabling assignments are posted on the website. Stall cards will be on stalls.

Pre-ordered bedding will be outside your stall, and additional bedding is available for \$10/bag at the show office. Please notify us before 12pm WEDNESDAY of your bedding order if you would like it to be at your stall on arrival.



SHOW CHECK-IN

If you have paid all fees and provided all required documents prior to arrival at the show, numbers will be available outside the show office. Please check the website for the most up to date information on ride times and stabling.

If all required documents have NOT been uploaded through the registration software or emailed to show staff, they must be provided when you check in at the show office before you collect your number.

Proof of current (dated within 12 months of show) negative Coggins test and proof of current Influenza vaccination must be provided before or at check in.

The Wyn Farm waiver can be accessed on our website, <https://www.wyn-farm.com/current-show-information.html>. This must be filled out once per year by each rider.



RIDE TIMES

Ride times for dressage riders are emailed by automated service to the email you registered with. A pdf is available on our website and ride times will also be posted on HorseShowOffice.com

There are no fixed ride times for Hunter/Jumper riders. An estimated schedule is posted on our website, broken out by class number. There is no set order within each class. We often are able to run ahead of that estimate, so please be on site at least 90 minutes before the estimated times of your classes. We will announce schedule updates throughout the day on the farm's PA or you can check with the ring steward for updated estimates.



SCHOOLING

Ring familiarization will be open from 2pm to 8pm on Friday.

Schooling times may be adjusted by show management as needed to maintain the show arena. Please be on the look out for equipment such as tractors and water trucks.

On show days, schooling and warmups are permitted in designated warmup arenas only. Arena familiarization permitted during show days only after all rides are complete.

Lunging is permitted **ONLY** in the indoor arena.



COMPETITOR ATTIRE

For dressage riders, Wyn Farm follows USEF/USDF rules for rider attire except that, as these are schooling shows, coats are optional. English dressage riders, if you choose not to wear a coat, please do not wear a stock tie. Either plain shirt collars or attached plain collars are acceptable. Show management may announce options for attire depending upon weather conditions. Protective vests may be worn either over or under coats (or worn without coats) without penalty.

ASTM/SEI safety rated helmets must be worn **AT ALL TIMES** while mounted. Appropriately heeled boots must also be worn by all riders while mounted.



FOOD/DRINKS

There is usually a food truck on site during the competition hours. Please check with show staff for more details if you have questions. There are also many restaurants in and around Williamston and show staff will be happy to answer any questions.



FACILITIES

Several Port-A-Potties are located near the showgrounds. Two are on the outside end wall of the more southern stall barns facing the jumper warmup and two are along the outside end wall of the indoor arena facing the show office. They are all stocked with toilet paper and hand sanitizer.



VETERINARY INFORMATION

In the interest of horse welfare and safety, show management does reserve the right to request an ill horse be removed from show grounds. Injured horses will not be allowed to compete.

If any emergency veterinary services are needed, the closest veterinary hospital is at Michigan State University. The address is 736 Wilson Rd., East Lansing, MI 48824. The phone number is (517) 355-6509.

Please speak to show management if you require additional veterinary help or information.



DOGS

Dogs must always be leashed while at Wyn Farm. No retractable leashes are allowed. Please do not leave your dogs unattended in any vehicles or trailers. No dogs are allowed in any of the schooling or show arenas. All dog poop must be picked up promptly and appropriately disposed of. Trash containers have been provided on show grounds. If you do bring your dog to the show, please make sure they have adequate water (and shade, if the weather is warm and sunny).
