Rider Divisions: JR/YR, AA, Open

Class Division & Championship Awards on Show Weekends

Levels: Introductory, Training Level, First Level, Second Level and Above, Western Dressage Intro, Western Dressage Basic, Western Dressage Level One & Above

Show Awards: Up to 6 Ribbons will be presented per class and rider division each show day. Show management retains the right to split large classes (>12 entries) or combine rider divisions with less than 3 entrants.

Weekend Championship Awards: Champion & Reserve Champion will be awarded for each class division noted above for the weekend. There must be at least 3 entries per division for championships to be awarded. Divisions may be combined or split at management's discretion. Championships will be awarded based on the average of the two highest test percentages per horse and rider team per class division. Each horse and rider combination must ride a minimum of two tests in the level for the weekend.

Year End Awards & Championships

To be eligible for year-end awards, the same horse and rider pair must compete in a minimum of six shows (each day is a show) They do not need to ride at the same level for all six shows. The combination must complete at least six tests at the level considered. Awards will be based on the average of the highest three percentages earned. One score must be from the highest test of the level shown. Series championship divisions may be combined or split at management discretion.

Year End Champion, reserve, and third through sixth place awards are given in the following class and rider divisions:

- Intro Level (JR/YR, AA, Open)
- Training Level (JR/YR, AA, Open)
- First Level (JR/YR, AA, Open)
- Second Level and above
- Western Dressage Intro (JR/YR, AA, Open)
- Western Dressage Basic (JR/YR, AA, Open)
- Western Dressage Level One and above

Special Classes Rules and Regulations

English and Western Musical Freestyles

- The Musical Freestyle class will be judged following the USDF guidelines for Training Level through Fourth Level, and the WDAA guidelines for Intro through Level 4.
 - The performance should clearly show unity between rider and horse and harmony in movements and transitions.
 - It is an open class, so that all levels of riders and all test levels will be combined for placings. A sound system will be available. **Please email us your music as an .mp3 file at shows@wyn-farm.com. As a backup, please have your music available as a MP3 on a device that can be plugged in using an auxiliary cord or a USB thumb drive.**

Entries

Entries must be submitted via online form at <https://horseshowoffice.com>. Entries close at midnight on close date. There will be a \$50.00 late fee for posting entries after the closing date. All Entry Fees are non-refundable after the closing date.

Please list any applicable membership numbers in the online entry (MDA or GLASS-ED).

Multiple riders are permitted to show one horse. Each horse can be ridden in 2 consecutive levels.

Only one ride per class for each horse and rider pair. Rider and horse combinations can enter multiple Test of Choice classes at the same level. But they cannot ride the same test on the same day in multiple classes. Each ride must be ridden with a different test following USEF/USDF rules regarding showing consecutive levels.

Show Fees (Friday-Sunday)

- Class fee: \$25/class
 - EMT & Office Fee: \$50
 - Stabling: \$150
 - Tack Stall: \$150 (may be limited by show management)
 - Shavings: \$10/bag
 - Camping Fee: \$25 (no hookups available)
 - Non-competing horse: \$35 (plus office fee)
 - Late Entry Fee: \$50.00 per entry (Any entry submitted in the Late Entry Window)
 - Class Change/Time Change Fee: \$25.00 per change (if possible) after the Show Registration window

Rider Division Qualifications

- Classes are split by JR/YR, AA, and Open for placings, but can be combined at Management's discretion.
- Junior (JR): Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- Young Rider (YR): Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.
- Adult Amateur (AA): Riders aged 22 & over as of January 1st, 2026, who do not qualify as professionals
- Open: All riders who do not qualify as JR/YR or AA
- Test of Choice Classes: Classes will be split by level, test, or JR/YR, AA, and Open if there are enough entries (>6 entries per division per class).
- Please specify the Level, Test (also specify test for TOC classes), and Division you plan to ride on your entry form. If no division is specified, the rider will be placed in the Open division.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Wyn Farm, operated by RDEquestrian LLC or "Horse Show Management" reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules/Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in dressage classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interests of the show.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, sponsoring entities, and facility harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire, negligence or otherwise.

Shows start at 9:00AM, but this is subject to change, please review ride times. Changes in ride times may be made by Horse Show Management after the closing date and publications of ride times. Ride times will be available Friday evening before the show at HorseShowOffice.com. Ride times are posted on the show office bulletin board on Friday.

EMT may be on grounds during show hours. The closest hospitals are UM Sparrow and McLaren Hospitals in Lansing, Michigan and there is an emergency room by UM Sparrow at 2446 Jolly Road in Okemos.

Tests are the current USDF, USEA, or WDAA Tests. Riders may have all tests read. Ties will be broken by the highest judges' corrective marks.

Coggins/Vaccination: No entry will be accepted without a photocopy of a negative Coggins test for each horse brought to the show grounds, with horse's name matching entry forms. A photocopy of a negative Coggins test dated within 12 months of the closing date of entered show must be submitted with each entry form. Entries submitted without a negative Coggins test will not be accepted. Proof of Influenza vaccination within the past 12 months is also required. Please submit documentation with entry.

Veterinary Care & Farrier Services: All local on call vets & farrier services in the area will be listed on our show office bulletin board on Friday during haul-in. This is to ensure the most up to date and available services at that time. The closest emergency large & small animal vet is Michigan State University on 736 Wilson Rd, East Lansing, MI 48824.

Protective Headgear: All riders must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet while mounted anywhere on the show grounds (professionals included). Any rider violating this rule will be immediately prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. RD Equestrian LLC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that serious injury may result despite wearing protective headgear as all equestrian sports involve an intrinsic element of risk.

Attire: All riders MUST wear approved ASTM helmets while mounted. Boots with a heel, shirt/jacket with collar and sleeves required. Riders in Intro may show in a polo shirt with a collared neck and half chaps. Western dressage riders must wear show attire, but chaps are optional.

Schooling: Management reserves the right to limit schooling in the show rings as needed. Lunging is only permitted in designated areas; prohibited on grass and in show arenas.

Rings: All weather footing. All tests will be run in a 20 x 60m (standard) arena or a 20 x 40m (small) arena. Ring size can be changed at management discretion. The warmup arena is 100 ft x 200 ft also with all weather footing. Please check with the show office on the availability of other schooling arenas on the grounds.

Scratches: After the show registration closing date, cancellations for any reason are charged all fees. No exceptions.

Campers: Camper Fee \$25.00 per weekend. No Electric or water hook up. May bring generators.

Dogs: ALL DOGS must be leashed. Dogs must ALWAYS be leashed while on the show grounds, (including handheld dogs). No dogs will be allowed in any schooling area, show ring or in the secretary office without management permission. Management reserves the right to ask a dog to leave the property. No leash may exceed 6 feet in length.

Smoking: No smoking on property.
